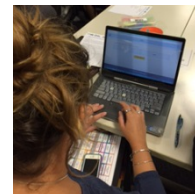

Books Prepared for Efficient Learning...

a. Endnotes

The way we create our eBooks takes many more hours than it does some other publishers. We take extra time to hyperlink endnote markers to endnotes and back to the text. This adds research and annotation value to our books and makes them much more useful to their users.

b. Table of Contents and Index

We hyperlink all Table of Contents and Index entries. If an index entry targets a particular place on the page (as in a dictionary or encyclopedia), the hyperlink points to the right destination on the page.

c. Bookmarks

Unlike many publishers, we bookmark not only chapters, but also subchapters, illustrations, graphs, and all other significant book elements.

d. Inter-book links

If a book is a commentary on another, clicking any reference to the commented on book, produces the relevant text in a separate window. This feature is most often found in the books of biblical commentaries, concordances, and lexicons. See the example above, where a Brown-Driver-Briggs Lexicon user clicks Isaiah 59:10 and sees its original text with a translation.

Select T-tool > highlight a passage > then right-click it to copy/paste it to other applications as editable text together with a bibliographical reference and a link back to the original page.

Use the image tool to copy/paste the passage as an image.

Search with a concordance-style display of results can be done in a given title or all books available in the library.

Email a link to a page or an entire book. JDL allows limited-time free access to anyone.

Click on any title to open that book in a separate window.

Highlight and then right-click to enable copy/pasting, printing, as well as "find" and "search" options.

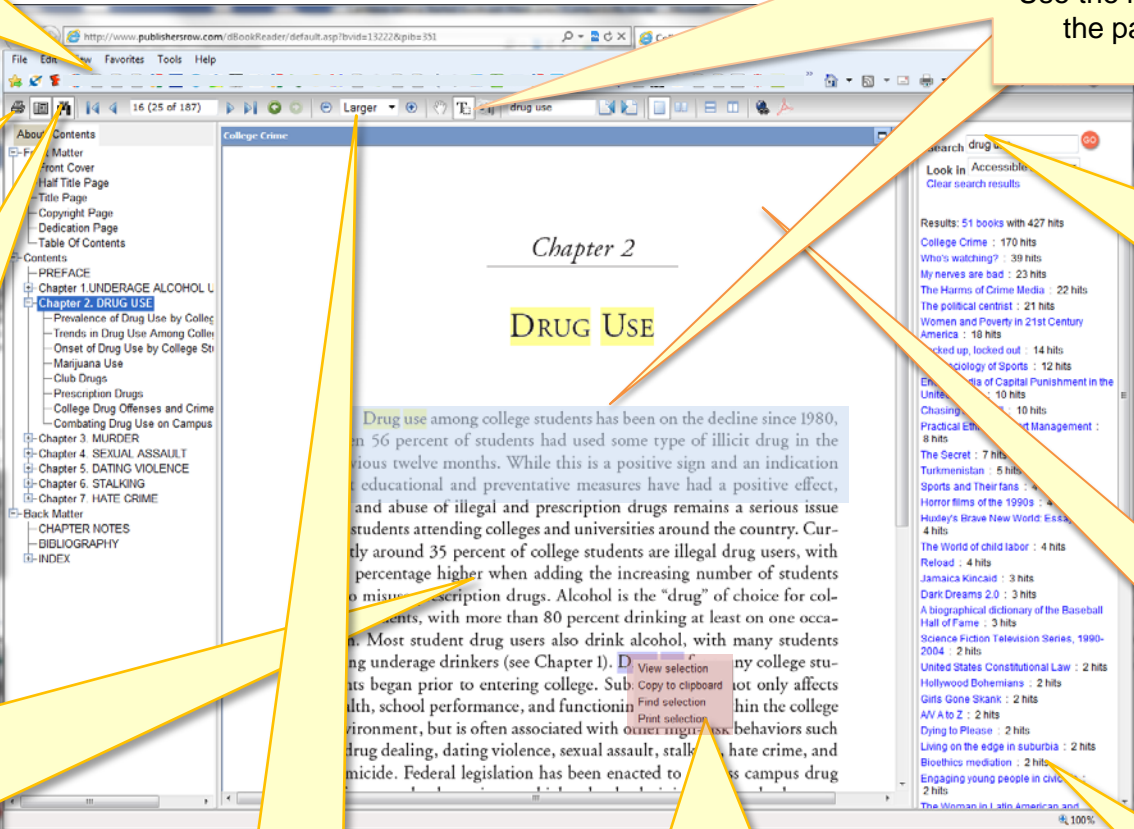
Zoom in/out pages without reducing the quality of the image.

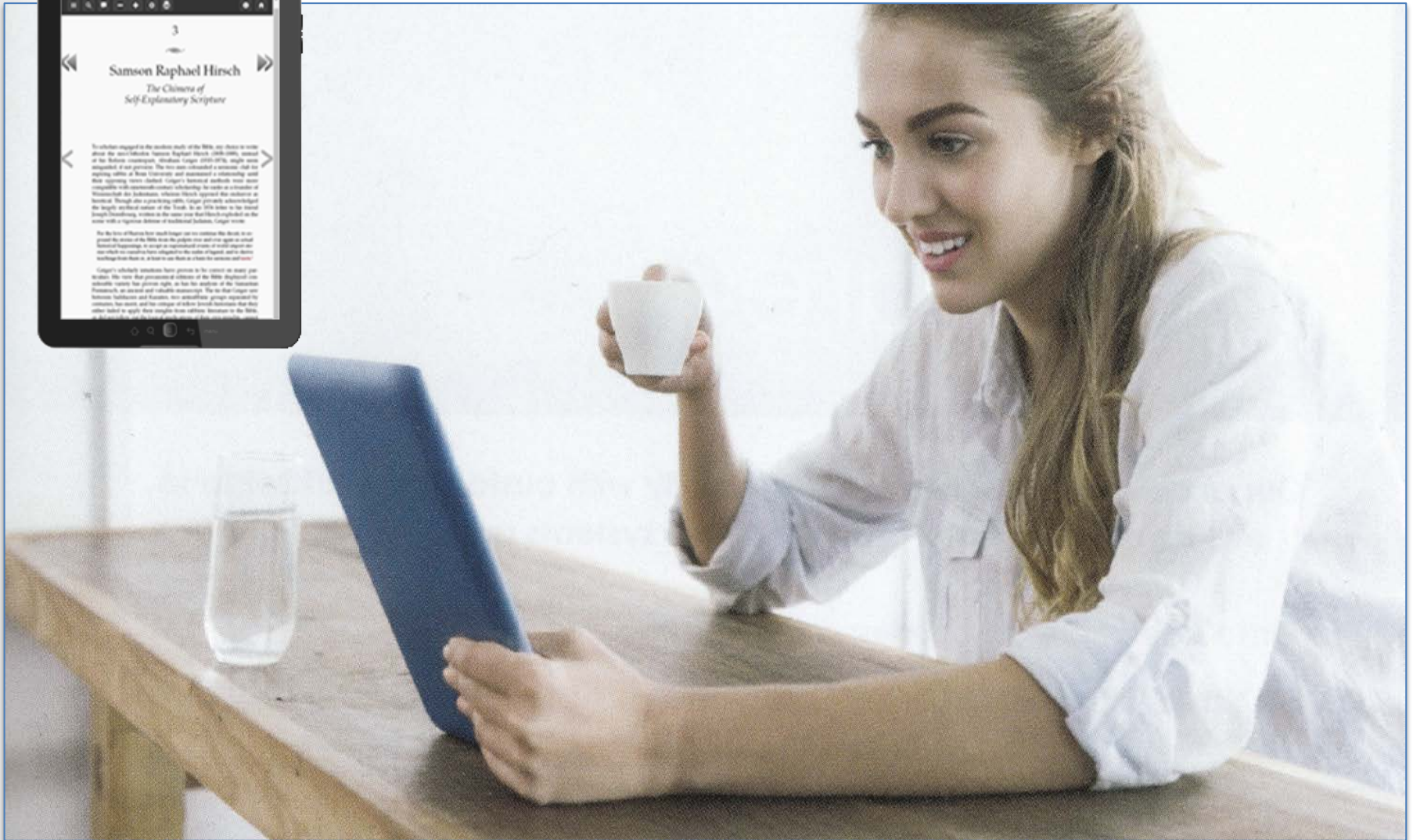
