Recited after the closing Torah blessing during the parents' 'aliyah.

For a bar mitzvah:

בָּרוּךְ שֶׁפְּטָרַנוּ מֵעָנְשׁוֹ שֶל זֶה. barukh shepetaranu me'onsho shel zeh.

For a bat mitzvah: בּרוּךְ שֶׁפְּטְרַנוּ מֵעְנְשָׁהּ שֶל זוֹ. barukh shepetaranu me'onshah shel zo.

Blessed is the One who has brought us to the moment that our child adopts adult religious responsibility.

Optional: May the Holy Blessed One continue to instill in our child love, compassion, a sense of duty, and a commitment to bring holiness into the world.

May we be blessed to step further back as we witness our child make decisions in keeping with her/his highest ideals and greatest potential.

Sheheheyanu (Blessing for Joyful Occasions):

בְּרוּךְ אַתְּה ה' אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם שֶׁהֶחֱיָנוּ וְקִיִמְנוּ וְהִגִּיעָנוּ לַזְזמַן הַזֶּה. barukh ata Adonai Elohenu melekh ha'olam sheheheyanu, vekiyemanu, vehigi'anu lazeman hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai, our God, Sovereign of the world, who has given us life, and sustained us, and brought us to this moment.
